## **Guarding from Being Thrown Off Track**

Deuteronomy 19 & 20 by Christian Sanich, 12/15/2024

19:1-10 Cities of refuge for those who accidentally killed someone

19:11-13 Premeditating murderers are supposed to be put to death. (ref.: Leviticus 24:17)

19:14 No moving boundary markers

19:15 Two or three witnesses shall confirm something is sin. (ref.: Matthew 18:16)

19:16-21 A malicious witness, wrongfully accusing someone, shall have the punishment he intended against someone.

The community addressing sin, in part, is supposed to make others fearful of sinning. (see 1 Timothy 5:19-20)

In the church, we're supposed to help one another get back on track with the Lord, by helping one another turn from sin. (see Matt. 18:15-20) 20:1-4 Do not be afraid, because the Lord goes with you, and will fight against your enemies.

20:5-9 Fears/over-concerns that would keep some Israelites home from war.

If we are overly-concerned with the <u>things of this world</u> we can get off track from the most important task at hand for us, which is following Jesus. (ref.: Mark 4:18-19)

If we are going to follow Jesus, <u>our own desires</u>, that can lead to sin, need to be defeated. The Holy Spirit can defeat those desires, if you walk by the Spirit. (ref.: Galatians 5:16-17)

20:10-20 Attempt peace with cities far from the Promise Land. But in the cities of the Promise Land, kill everything that breathes.

The <u>people of our culture</u> can throw us off track from following the Lord. Be on guard that they do not influence you. (ref.: 1 Corinthians 5:9-10, 2 Corinthians 6:14-17, 1 Peter 2:9-12)
