Jesus' response regarding rewards

What time period? **In the regeneration.**

Special reward for the apostles

(References: Revelation 20:4-6, 22:5, 1 Corinthians 6:2-3)

Reward for everyone who has followed Jesus

**If we sacrifice relationships**

**If we sacrifice material possessions**

**We will receive a 100x as much in the regeneration.**

And all who follow Jesus will inherit eternal life.

**Application questions for 10/6/2014 sermon  
Matthew 19:27-30**

If you understand the millennium, what does it add to your perception of why the way we live our lives as Christian matters?

Why might we lose relationships with non-Christians, because we are really living for Christ?

Have you lost any relationships specifically because of being a Christian, because of your morals or values, or because of sharing the gospel with someone?

How do we reconcile that as right, and worth it?

In what ways might we make sacrifices of possessions, for the sake of Jesus?

Do you understand that the millennium is different than the eternal state?

And do you understand that our works or sacrifices don't earn us salvation in eternity, but rather earn us rewards/blessing in the millennium?

How do we get salvation in the eternal state? (We get it as a free gift, or we inherit" it as Jesus said in this passage, through faith in Jesus)

Be honest. What do you want more, to be important and to have in this life, or to be important and to have in the millennial kingdom?

If you want to want it in the millennium, but you don't actually live that way, what do you think might need to change so you can actually be motivated by this day to day?
