9:00AM

12:00PM & 3:00PM

5:00PM, the workers no one else seemed to want - Gentiles

The payment of the laborers

Those who came to work last, were paid generously.

Those who came to work first, were paid their due.

Their grumbling

(ref.: Numbers 14:27, 16 esp. 16:8, 11)

The response of the master

Associate vs. Friend (ref.: Matthew 22:12, 26:50)

Take what is yours and go away.

Conclusions: The great reversal - last to first, first to last

Application questions for 10/12/14 sermon Matthew 20:1-16

What did this passage reveal to you about what God is like? There is more than one answer possible.

(He is just or "fair". He is generous. He is good to let people serve Him.)

Do you think that is every a right claim? And why do you answer that way?

What is the one thing, which seems central to the message of the parable, that you want to take away from this?
