Text sermon questions, during the sermon, to (602) 824-8030

What immediate precedes to the Lord appearing (v. 29)

Right after the tribulation of those days

Crazy events in the heavens

God is coming (v. 30)

All the people of the earth will recognize it, and mourn.

God is coming (continued) (v. 30)

The Son of Man is the King of the universe...

coming with power

and great glory

coming on the clouds of heaven

The gathering up of the Lord's people (v. 31)

He commands the angels.

Some ways this could be important to you

Humanity won't end like people speculate it might.

Repent of your sins and trust the Jesus before He comes.

Be encouraged.

**Application questions for 5/31/15 sermon
Matthew 24:29-31**

Prior to hearing this sermon, when you think about the Lord coming again, would you say that you were scared, excited, or something other?

Did this sermon impact/change that at all, and how?

What do you expect to see right prior to Jesus appearing, and why do you say that?
(Don't spend too much time here, especially on any theological rabbit trail.)

Are you convinced that you will recognize the Lord's second coming when it happens, that it will be obvious, even if you are not absolutely sure what it will look like? Why or why not?

From this passage, what imagery most powerful supports, to you, that Jesus is God?
(His glory, His power, Him riding on the clouds, Him commanding the angels)

(Make sure to get to this question, and try to have each person share.)

How does it encourage you, to know that that Jesus will gather up from the earth those who trust Him, and they will join Jesus in air with all those who have trusted Him who have passed, and you will be with Him always?

Does that prompt you to any action...

like repentance, or wanting to share Jesus more with others, or something else?
