2:10 God, in His wisdom, saw fit for Jesus to suffer

If God sees fit to allow suffering, and has a purpose for it, no-one should question Him. (ref.: Job 38:1-42:6)

God can achieve great things through suffering.

Jesus is the perfect example.

We need to remember this when we suffer.

God can mature us through suffering. (ref.: James 1:2-4)

2:11 Jesus is sanctifying us, His little brothers

Jesus understands the obstacles we face in becoming godly.

He is there for us, to lead and help us.

2:12-13 Jesus not only proclaimed God, He trusted Him

(Psalm 22:22 and Isaiah 8:17-18)

We are to follow His teachings and His example.

Do God's will. Obey God.

By being controlled by the Holy Spirit.

Do you want to be more holy, like God intends us to be?

Drawing in to Jesus is critical for this to happen.
