4:1 Let us fear, if you seem to have failed to reach His rest

4:2-3a We must unite hearing the good news with believing it

We who trust Jesus are entering into God's heavenly rest.

4:3-5 God's ultimate rest for people still remains. Don't miss it.

(ref.: Psalm 95:7-11)

God rested after creation to establish a principle.

(ref.: Genesis 2:1-3)

4:6-8 Since it is remaining for some to enter into God's ultimate rest, "Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts."

4:9 The ultimate rest still remains for the people of God

Become one of the God's people by grabbing hold of Jesus.

4:10 Jesus has lead the way into heaven for us

(ref.: Revelation 14:13)

4:11 Therefore let us strive to enter into that ultimate rest

Finish your journey toward God.
