15:20 **The very first resurrection is proof of more to come**

15:21-22 **Death vs. life**

All in Adam are in sin. That gets us eternal separation from God.
(ref.: Romans 5:12)

All in Christ get made alive to eternal relationship with God.

15:23 **Christians will be resurrected at Christ's 2nd coming**

15:24-28 **In the end, everything will be back in proper order**

Christ is abolishing all rule and all authority and power,
including death.

15:29-34 **Living like the resurrection is real**

Witness even if it's uncomfortable.

Stop sinning, *in part*, for the sake of your witness.

15:35-41 **Giving the dead new bodies is no problem for God**

He has already proven He is a magnificent creator.

15:42-44 **We can look forward to our resurrected bodies**

Now perishable, raised imperishable

Now dishonorable, raised in glory

Now weak, raised in power

Now natural, raised spiritual
