Money Perspective, and Priorities

What does it mean to you to seek God's righteousness? What are righteous things?

What does it mean to you, for those to be priority number one in your life, over pursuing money and stuff?

How might you want to change your priorities?

Is there some kingdom thing you want to start doing, or thing you want to do the way God says is right, and especially something that you seeking to hard after money has kept you from?

Do you think there is anything in you that desires to get rich, or is always desiring more money or stuff? How strong is that desire?

What dangers do you think there are in that? If you can name some specific things you've seen happen with people, please share. Of if you have any ideas about what might happen, please share.
