Review of Hebrews 1-9

10:1-4 The Levitical Law system could not perfect its worshippers

Have to be clean of sin to worship God

That system was never intended by God to make people perfectly clean of sin.

Animal sacrifices were a constant reminder that they could never permanently get rid of sin.

10:5-10 Christ perfects worshippers

In a body, Christ did God's will perfectly. (ref.: Ps. 40:6-8)

Christ offered Himself as the perfect sacrifice.

Once we have, in Christ, become clean before God, we can then rightly worship God.

We who trust Christ are made holy.

So we can rightly worship God.

Ways to Worship in Everyday Life

Prayerfully mark some of categories you want to work on, and maybe take a few notes. Then, keep this sheet of paper somewhere that it will remind you to pray each day over these. Pray for change. Pray for God's help. Pray that you would live God's ways in your life, as ways of worshipping God.

Keep reading God's written word to find out His ways.

Keep taking off the old ways, and putting on the new.

Change how you relate to other Christians - speak truth, deal properly with your feelings about others' sin, only speak what is useful for building up, be kind, and give grace

Be anxious about nothing; rather, pray about everything.

Keep bad stuff out of your mind; ponder the good - what is true, dignified, pure, toward brotherly love, good reports of others, what is praise-worthy by God

Give yourself to healthy conflict resolution. Don't run from it. Join in helping brothers in Christ work out their conflicts. Be known for being reasonable.

Children, obey your parents.

Honor your father and mother - respect them, and help take care of their needs.

Parents, discipline and instruct your kids, without provoking them to resentment.

Wives, submit to and respect your husband, as you do Christ. Husbands, love your wife sacrificially, like Christ loved the church, and take care of her as well as you do yourself.

Singles, use the opportunity of your singleness to pay more attention to the Lord and for more service to the Lord. And be holy with your body, sexually pure.

Serve the Lord in your job. Work hard with a good attitude.

Have daily quiet time to pray and read the Bible.

Be satisfied with what you have, not always wanting more. Make your first priority God's kingdom and righteousness, and trust Him to provide for you.

Don't lust. Commit to fight, and maybe for life.

God empowers our obedience.
