The New Covenant Relationship with God

Hebrews 10:11-18

10:11-12 **The Jewish priests stand repeatedly offering sacrifices, but after His one sacrifice, Christ sat down.**

Their sacrifices only took care of past sins.

Christ's one sacrifice took care of all sins.

10:13-14 **The balance of secured and sure, but in process.**

Christ's enemies will be submitted, but it's in process in the present time.

Christ's people will be perfected, but we are in the process of being perfected in the present time.

Sanctification process

10:15-17 **The balance of our sins being forgiven and forgotten, but us still caring to not sin.**

10:18 **Offering for sins is no longer necessary. We are forgiven.**

Beware of anyone or any religious teaching that says something else is needed to make you acceptable to God.

We should be extremely grateful to God.

Have you in the past had any religious influence, or more importantly is there any influence in your life right now, that says there is something else you need to do to be accepted by God, other than trust Jesus Christ? Tell us about that.

What do you think about that, in light of what we have learned?

Has any of this made you think differently, or is there any way you think you need to live differently?
