John 17:21; Philippians 2:1-2; Romans 15:5-6, Ephesians 1:8b-10 & 5:31-32 Mark Buckley, August 25, 2019

1. Our unity leads to effective evangelism.

John 17:21:

²¹ that they may all be one; even as You, Father, are in Me and I in You, that they also may be in Us, so that the world may believe that You sent Me.

2. Our unity is the Lord's priority.

Philippians 2:1-2:

- ¹ Therefore if there is any encouragement in Christ, if there is any consolation of love, if there is any fellowship of the Spirit, if any affection and compassion,
- ² make my joy complete by being of the same mind, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose.

3. Our unity brings glory to God.

Romans 15:5-6:

- ⁵ Now may the God who gives perseverance and encouragement grant you to be of the same mind with one another according to Christ Jesus,
- ⁶ so that with one accord you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

4. Our unity is the mystery of God's will.

Ephesians 1:8b-10:

⁸... In all wisdom and insight ⁹ He made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His kind intention which He purposed in Him

5. The unity of Christ and the church.

Ephesians 5:31-32:

³¹ For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and shall be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.

¹⁰ with a view to an administration suitable to the fullness of the times, that is, the summing up of all things in Christ, things in the heavens and things on the earth.

³² This mystery is great; but I am speaking with reference to Christ and the church.
